

When returning your Absentee Ballot by mail or through the Ballot Drop Box, please be sure to enclose your ballot in Envelope B completed, sealed and inside of the pre-paid postage envelope which was provided in your ballot pack. #### How to Vote:

You can request an Absentee Ballot be mailed to you, you can vote early at the Elections Office, or you can vote at your normal polling location on Election Day!

The last day to get registered or make changes to your name or address to be eligible to vote in this election is Monday, October 16, 2023 by 5 p.m.

New legislation allows voters who miss this deadline above to use Same Day Registration to

register and vote using a Provisional Ballot that will be reviewed after the election by the Electoral Board. Please register to vote or update your information today!

Early voting starts on Friday, September 22, 2023. Office hours: Monday-Friday from 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Do not forget to bring your acceptable ID!

In addition to our regular office hours, we will be open: Saturday, October 28 from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m., and Saturday, November 4, from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. for the last day of Early Voting.

# News from the Commissioner of the Revenue:

# Do you use your land for farming?

Gloucester County has a Land Use Program which allows taxpayers to apply for specially reduced assessments on certain real estate devoted to agriculture, horticulture and forest uses.

The program's requirements include:

- Five acres minimum of contiguous land for Agricultural and Horticultural lands (excluding a one-acre home site)
- 20 acres minimum of contiguous land for Forest Use (excluding a one-acre home site)

# If you meet the requirements...

The filing deadline for new applications and Revalidation Forms will be November 1.

As a participant in the Land Use Program, the property owner is responsible for notifying the COR Office within 60 days following any change in use

#### **Know Your Zone**

Virginia evacuation zones designated A through D are in place across coastal Virginia. In the event of a storm or other emergency, residents of one or more zones may be directed to evacuate depending on tides, storm intensity, path, and other factors.

#### **Bee Alert**

Make sure you're signed up for Bee Alert, Gloucester County's emergency notification system. Bee Alert will be used to notify you about imminent threats to health and safety, and informational notifications that affect your locations or work environments. Register today by calling 804-693-1390.

#### **CERT**

Interested in joining the Gloucester County Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)? Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. #### **Prepare an Emergency Supply Kit**

- At least one gallon of water per person, per day for at least three days
- At least a three-day supply of nonperishable food
- Battery-powered radio/NOAA weather radio

# A message from Social Services:

Since the ending of the Public Health Emergency, the benefits enrollment process has returned to normal operations. To help Virginians continue to receive high quality health care coverage, there are important steps for customers to take.

To ensure that members obtain important paperwork, your up-to-date mailing address and phone number are needed. Members can make updates:

- Online at <u>commonhelp.virginia.gov</u>
- By calling 1-855-242-8282
- By calling their local Department of Social Services

It is important for members to respond to their mail promptly. The Gloucester Department of Social Services continues to get an overwhelming amount of returned mail to their office, which may impact the status of your benefits.

Medicaid recipients are encouraged to take the steps in the bulleted list.

If you are a recipient who gets their mail at the Department of Social Services, please visit the office regularly to pick up your mail. This will ensure that you receive your important notices promptly.

# 2023 2nd Installment Real Estate, Personal Property & Mobile Home bills will be mailed in early November.

# What do I need to do?

- Check your bills for completeness upon receipt. Real estate and personal property bills may be mailed in the same envelope if the owner and address are identical. lf you have questions about any items listed or feel that an item is missing, please contact the Commissioner of Revenue at 804-693-3451.
- If you have not received your tax bill(s) by the middle of November, please contact the Treasurer's Office at 804-693-2141. By law, failure to receive a bill does not relieve the taxpayer of penalty and interest that will accrue for failure to pay by the due date.
- If you purchased real estate after January 1, 2023, and you did not receive a bill, please contact the Treasurer's Office at 804-693-2141.

# When are tax payments due?

The 2023 2nd installment tax bills

are due December 5, 2023. There are options to pay in the Treasurer's Office, by dropping an envelope in the mailbox outside the Treasurer's Office, or by visiting

#### gloucesterva.gov/treasurer.

Payments made in the Treasurer's Office by, or postmarked with the date of, December 5, 2023, or before, will be accepted as timely. Accounts remaining unpaid after December 5, 2023, will be subject to additional charges as provided by the Code of Virginia and the

Gloucester County Code.

In many cases, banks that allow online bill-pay will process payments and then mail a physical check to the Treasurer's Office. That task can take several days. If you choose this method, plan ahead to ensure your payment reaches the Treasurer's Office before the due date.

#### **SCHOOL MEAL PRICES FOR 2023-2024**


Continuing in this school year, Abingdon Elementary, Achilles Elementary, Bethel Elementary, Petsworth Elementary and Page Middle School are all Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Schools.

"CEP is a powerful new tool that allows high poverty schools and school divisions to offer breakfast and lunch to all students at no charge. In addition, the measure streamlines school meal operations by eliminating the need to collect and process meal applications" (Virginia Hunger Solutions).

Unfortunately, Botetourt Elementary, Peasley Middle and Gloucester High School do NOT qualify for this provision so they are all paid schools. Here are their prices:

# Looking to invest money for the first time? Here are a few things before you get started.

# Have you clarified your investment goal?

Are you looking to preserve your funds and keep them in a relatively safe investment? Low-risk, interest rate investments like certificates of deposit, treasury securities, and high grade bonds may make sense for you. Are you looking to maximize your current income with periodic payments from your investments? Maybe corporate and municipal bonds, as well as stocks that pay dividends, are better investments for you. Are you looking to grow the value of your investments for the long-term? You would likely want to consider including stocks/equities in your investment portfolio.

Here's a preview: diversification is important! One common rule of thumb is to have at least 30 different stocks or investments, with no single investment making up more than 5%

of your total portfolio. Also, be sure that investments are in different industries. If all 30 stocks are in the oil industry, and oil prices decline, that could negatively affect your entire portfolio! Also, be sure to properly asset allocate: even if you're investing aggressively, with most of your investment in equities and consider having some investment funds in fixed-income investments (such as bonds). A common approach for retirement investments is to calculate 100 minus your age (more aggressive investors may consider 110 or 120 minus age), and have that be the percentage of your retirement portfolio invested in equities/stocks. If you don't have the time, money, or expertise to diversify and asset allocate yourself, look into investments such as mutual funds

and ETFs that diversify for you and see if they fit your investment goals!

Before you invest too many of your assets, be sure you have funds set aside in case of a major emergency (large medical bills, insurance deductibles, job loss). A common suggestion is to keep three to six months' worth of household expenses in liquid assets (like a savings account, for instance).

#### **THINKING ABOUT JOINING A 4-H?**

4-H Clubs are a fun way to build life skills for ages 9-18, and we welcome new members and volunteers! 4-H members participate in a variety of learning experiences while building citizenship and leadership qualities.

Clubs are supported by adult volunteer leaders (at least 2) and focus on one or more project areas. There are national and state level projects in many different curriculum areas. From sewing to aerospace, livestock to cooking, photography, wood working and engineering, there is something for everyone.

In some clubs everyone works in the same project area, and others are community centered, and each member selects their own area of interest. Youth record their work in project books which we do our best to fund with local resources. There are no fees to join.

In a 4-H Club, youth may also participate community service projects, contests, conferences, camps and events sponsored by the county, district, state and national 4-H organizations.

A club usually has one club meeting and one project meeting or activity each month, or a club may choose to have one monthly meeting in which all the activity and club business is completed. It is up to you. In the past we've had some clubs meet every other week, and some which meet only once.

New members can join any time during the year, but for some project eligibility for state events, the state requires that students be enrolled by certain dates.

Some clubs meet all year, while others do not hold regular meetings after the school year ends. The official start of the new 4-H year is October 1.

Gloucester also has a 4-H Cloverbud group for children ages 5-8.
